INVERTED FEATHER BUTTER DISH by Greg Dilian...



Back in November of 2016, I was scanning the items for sale on Ebay. Lo and behold, the first thing I see is a marigold Cambridge Inverted Feather butter dish. Now I have been looking for an Inverted Feather butter dish in any of the known colors, amethyst, marigold or green. I had three pieces of a complete four piece amethyst table set which Tom Burns sold at my auction in Hagerstown in 2015. I had given up on finding the elusive butter. Since then I have bought an Inverted Feather marigold spooner and creamer so I had my eyes open for either the covered

sugar or the butter. So, when I saw this piece, I knew that I had to have it. The bidding was quite active but at the end I entered a ridiculous price and won it for \$535. It is in perfect condition with super color. Any pieces in this table set are very rare regardless of the color.

I had pieced together my three piece amethyst set in the 1990's and waited almost 20 years in hope of finding an amethyst butter dish. I found the creamer in an antique show in New Jersey in 1993 and I bought the spooner from Tom Burns in his room at the 1995 NECGA Convention when it was held in West Springfield. The sugar was also purchased from Tom in 1997 via a phone bid. So, as you can see these pieces are quite elusive. After I won the marigold butter on eBay, I called Tom up and he said that in his entire Carnival Glass career he had never seen a complete butter dish in marigold. He did remember selling a cover to the Bookers many years ago. I also asked Jim Seeck about it and he said he had never even seen a marigold butter dish in this pattern.

Cambridge, as you know, made limited amounts of Carnival Glass. The colors are amethyst, green and marigold with the latter usually the most hard to find. Looking at Dave Doty's website, no marigold butter dishes have ever sold. So, this was really a great find. Now who has a Marigold Inverted Feather covered sugar bowl they'd be willing to sell?

Galen and I were traveling across Pennsylvania, and saw an auction on auctionzip – and the second item up for sale is going to be a Tree Trunk funeral vase! How can you resist going to an auction with a Tree Trunk funeral vase?

So we talked to Steve and Gary (just think of the wonderful conversations we could have on a 4 hour trip (each way), right? Right! We all managed to get up at 4:30 am so we could leave at 5:30, and there is one nice thing about that: traffic is really pretty light. Thank goodness.



We made it to the auction and walk in – sure enough, the whole gang was there! Doug & Sue, Darrell, Toby & Max, Dan Prince, and a few other familiar faces. It was nice to see that there were many other people there bidding on the carnival glass.

The Dotta auction group did a great job looking the glass over and listing any damage they found, so once the auction started, everyone was ready. I think everybody got something (although we didn't get the piece we really wanted, but that's okay – because there is always another piece, another auction). In case you were wondering, it would appear that Steve and Gary still must kind of like Northwood's Grape & Cable....and it may look like Galen and I are still hooked on carnival glass – and big fish!

Since almost all of the carnival glass was at the beginning of the sale, we actually left early and stopped at 3 antique shops on the way back to Connecticut. We didn't find anything to bring home (although we did see some carnival and one even had fresh venison). It was a wonderful day, with carnival friends, and beautiful glass – life is GOOD!!

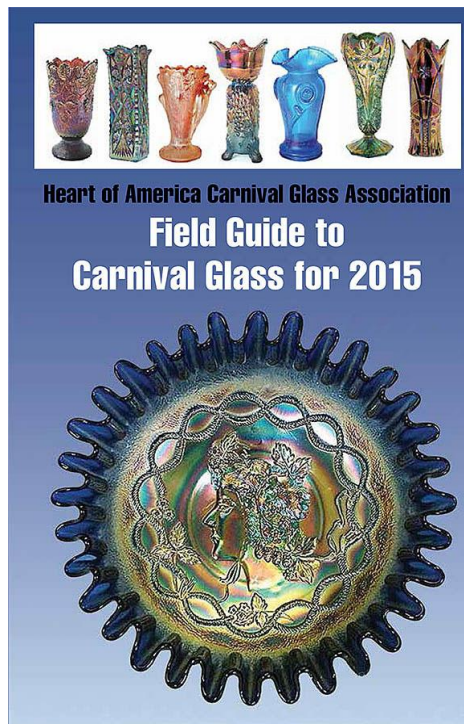
