A Hunting We Will Go!

When you're out seeking swans, Fenton glass, or other collectibles, it's good to be prepared! Here are some tips from veteran Fenton collectors.

- Carry a small notebook listing your key wants, including colors and dimensions.

 Have a compact ruler or steel tape measure to check sizes.



 A battery-powered black light helps spot repairs or damage.

- A magnifying glass or jeweler's loupe is great for checking details.

- Use the "browser's" cards supplied by many antique/collectible malls to record showcase numbers and item descriptions.


– Take your reference books along for the ride (some collectors advise "have a hardback for home and a paperback to carry in the car").

Fenton Swans... and close cousins!



swimming swan is a splendid sight. Swans have a long history in decorative art, gracing all manner of ceramic items and frequently depicted in glass.

At least three companies (Fenton, Dugan-Diamond, and Imperial) made similar swan novelties in glass. Linking each swan to its manufacturer is challenging, and careful attention to some fine details is essential.

Imperial's swan has realistic neck feathers, so it can be

identified quickly. Before closing in 1984, Imperial made its No. 147 swan in many colors, from milk glass to the Carnival glass hues of the 1970s. Look for the "IG" mark on these.

The Dugan firm (located in Indiana, PA) made its swan in opalescent colors about 1907-10, and these may have this factory's distinctive D-in-diamond trademark. In the mid-1920s, after this organization had been re-named the Diamond Glass Co., its swan appeared in pink and green.



About this same time, Fenton made its own swan mould and produced them in Florentine Green and Celeste Blue. Both the Fenton and Dugan-Diamond swans have a



series of small raised dots on their necks, but the details on the tail feathers of Fenton's swan differ from the Dugan-Diamond examples. This 1920s Fenton mould was not used again.

> Fenton acquired the Dugan-Diamond swan mould not long after their plant was destroyed by fire in 1931. Frank L. Fenton, Robert C. Fenton, and some others went to Indiana, PA, to see what they could buy as salvage (Bill Fenton, then 7 years young, went along). Some fixtures were purchased

as were a number of moulds. About 1938, Fenton used the mould acquired from Diamond to make a swan for the Fenton line. Designated simply the "No. 4 swan," this item was produced in crystal with some areas satin finished by acid.



Years later, the Diamond mould in Fenton's storage area became the inspiration for new Fenton moulds. Our 5127 Swan has

been a fixture in the regular Fenton line for over a decade, and you can find it in many different colors (the Fenton oval mark is on the outside bottom). The Swan is decorative and functional, as folks use them to hold potpourri, cotton balls, soaps, or bath salts!
