

General Directions to the Hotel in Leominster

From Boston Logan International Airport

Take Interstate 95 or Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to 495 North to Exit 27 Bolton. Take 117 West for 8 miles then turn right onto Interstate 190 North (I-190 North becomes Route 2 West) to the Route 12 Fitchburg Exit (Exit 31B). Turn right at the first light.

From North

Take I-95 South to 495 South to Route 2 West (Exit 29B). Follow Route 2 West to Route 12 Fitchburg (Exit 31B). Turn right at the first light.

From West

Take I-90 to Exit 10 to I-290 East to I-190 North. Follow I-190 North (which becomes Route 2 West) to Route 12 North Fitchburg (Exit 31B). Turn right at the first light.

From South

Take Interstate 84 to Interstate 90 East to Interstate 290 East (Exit 10). Follow Interstate 190 North (which becomes Route 2 West) to Route 12 North Fitchburg (Exit 31B). Turn right at the first light.

SONGBIRD TUMBLER by Bob Smith



This very pretty rich marigold tumbler comes to us out of India. Although it has all the characteristics of your typical Jain tumbler, this is the product of one of several carnival glass manufacturers that are spread around India. Molded into the base of this glass are the large capital letters "B.M". This stood for B.M. Glass Works which was located in Firozabad – the same city in which the Jain Glass Works, Ltd. was located.

A word here about the tendency of collectors to label all Indian carnival glass as being made by Jain Glass. There were at least seven other companies that made carnival glass and can be traced and that many again that cannot be located at this time. Indian glass companies were no different than those in the USA and other countries. When other Indian glass companies saw that Jain iridescent glass was becoming popular, they too jumped on the bandwagon.

The principal design on the tumbler is repeated twice. There is a bird perched on the top of a berry ladened tree branch with elongated leaves against a background of thin raised lines. Above this is a row of small circles below a band of interlocking diamonds.

The glass was made from a two part mold. Its measurements are: 4 5/8" high; a 2 3/4" rim; and a 1 7/8" wide base. There are a few of these known in the USA and Australia at the moment, so they should be considered very scarce if not rare.

KNOWING THE DIFFERENCE

Recently while scanning E-bay, I noted a vase up for bidding which was identified as Pulled Loop by Dugan in Marigold. As I viewed the vase, it immediately became apparent that it was not Pulled Loop, nor was it a vase by Dugan. The photos were somewhat dark and out of focus, but I was able to see that it was a vase made by Millersburg in the pattern known as Tulip Scroll, as pictured here. And it should be evident that the vase that I bid on and won arrived in a color different than Marigold. Yes, it is a radium finished Amethyst vase. The value increased, as did the reason we have "Show & Tell" at our Club Meetings, so that various patterns and makers become more evident to our members.
