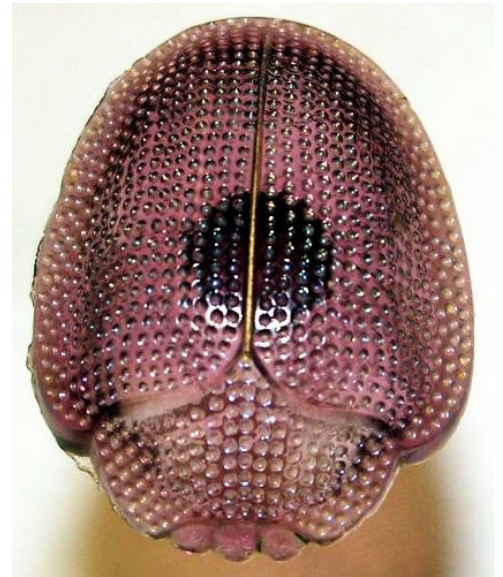

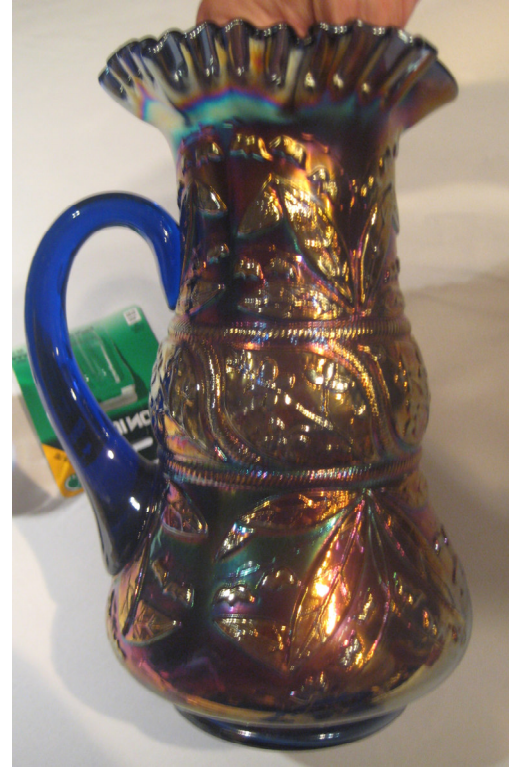

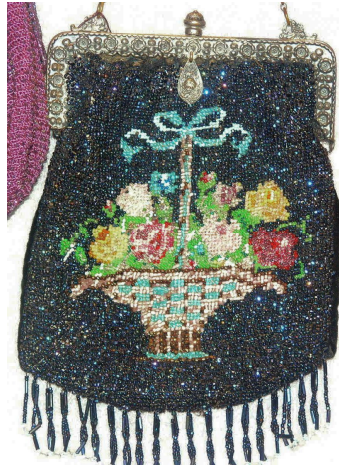

FENTON'S RIBS by Bob Smith



Among some carnival collectors you can get a discussion going as to whether this tumbler is actually a Fenton product or not. Some dealers tend to think that this might have been made by Jeannette. I am not one of those who share such doubts although I have not seen it in any Fenton catalog.

This is the exact tumbler (minus the two stippled fish scale bands) as the Fenton Scale Bands tumbler. It has the exact 24 interior ribs inside the glass as the Scale Bands and also has the very same dimensions. This tumbler is a rich marigold color, whereas the Scale Bands comes in the same color plus the rare blue and green colors.

There are far fewer of the Fenton's Ribs to be found than the regular Scale Bands tumbler. I tend to believe that some of these were produced before the Scale Bands and someone had the afterthought that the addition of the two bands would improve the design. The measurements for this tumbler (and for the Scale Bands tumblers are: 4" high, 3 1/8" rim, and a 2 7/8" base. Happy Hunting!
