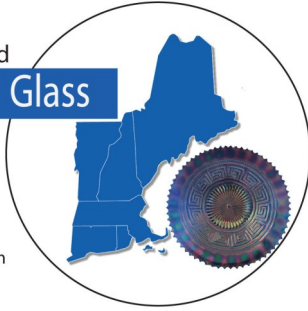

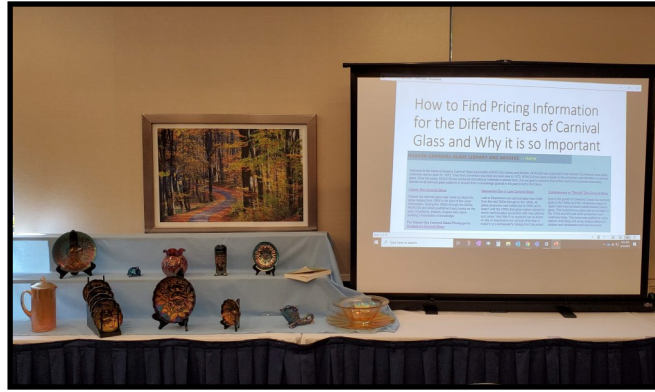

Bo and Randy Jones, the Banquet presenters, shared 50 pieces of Millersburg Glass from their personal collection.



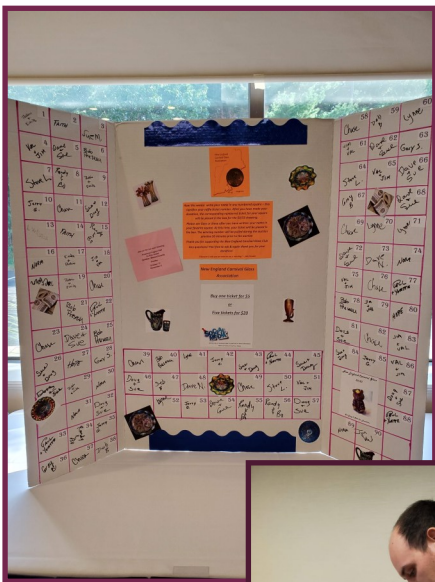





