

## **REGAL CANE by Bob Smith**

Every day many cars drive on to an ordinary parking lot in Cosweg, Germany, park for a while, do what they have to do and then drive off the lot. Unbeknownst to the drivers is the fact that two previous generations before them worked on that very spot producing some of the finest Carnival Glass ever made in Europe. This lot was the spot where Brockwitz Glasfabrik AG, better known to us today as just plain Brockwitz, made their



wonderful glass. This was the place where the little gem of a tumbler named the Regal Cane was born.

There is a Brockwitz catalog dated 1928 in which the tumbler is shown along with twenty-five other shapes in the Regal Cane pattern. This would put the manufacturing date somewhere between 1926 and 1928. Their name for the pattern was "Harmmonia". As of today, only three of the shapes have surfaced: a pitcher, a tumbler and an ashtray. I was told there was a clock that had the pattern around it that was sold at a Britt auction in the 1900's. Initially this was thought to be a unique specially ordered item, but with the recent discovery of a 1915 catalog the clock is indeed a part of their regular glass items.

The tumbler itself packs a lot of beauty and desirability for its size and design, being only 3 3/9" high. The rich marigold iridescence for which Brockwitz is noted has worked its magic on the glass. The rim of the tumbler is 2 3/8" wide and directly below it is a plain band 3 3/8" wide. Below this are 16 panels of the cane pattern. Eight panels have three circles with three knobbed squares between them. The other eight panels have four circles with three knobbed squares between them. The other between them. The panels are alternated giving it a cane like

appearance. The base of the tumbler is 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" wide and has a sixteen point star on it. The Regal Cane tumbler was made using a four piece mold.

The broader and taller pitcher better displays just how pretty the Regal Cane pattern can be. Like the tumbler is has a band just below the rim with the cane pattern completely covering the rest of the pitcher. The catalog shows it with just two tumblers on a rather small tray. Given the capacity of the pitcher to hold several liquid servings it seems reasonable that it comes in a complete water set even if not shown in the catalog.

Both the tumbler and the taller pitcher are considered to be rare. Brockwitz did export its glass to places like South America and Australia and other countries. Whether they shipped any Regal Cane to the United States has not yet been confirmed. The 1925 Congress passed a law that required all imported glass show the country of origin. As of this date I have not heard of any of the pieces have words "Made in Germany" as required by this law. If you are not lucky enough to find a stray piece in an antique shop or flea market, I guess the alternative is EBay.

# **Imperial's Swirl Rib**

There are many pieces of Carnival Glass that may not be expensive and grab people's attention.

Upon reading an article on Imperial Swirl Rib on <u>Carnival 101</u>, we recalled seeing a console bowl and plate at a local antiques store. Getting the best of us, we drove up to the store with tape measurer in hand and discovered that the dimensions were much larger than was written about. Bowls have been documented in sizes 6"-9" and plates 8", 9" and 12". The bowl that we purchased was 11 1/4" and the plate was 14 1/4".

We reported our find to Carnival Glass 101 with photographs and dimensions, and the editors quickly posted the information to their site.

On the weekend of May 11, we attended a Tom Burns Auction in Bath, New York, and had the winning bid on the Swirl Rib Candlesticks, which are a variant of Premium pattern. These have a swirled rib pattern on the underside, and the Premium candlesticks do not.

What a wonderful Console Set.


Swirl Rib can be found in flat plates, plates, several sized bowls, candlesticks, vases, stemmed sherberts, centerhandled servers, cups, saucers, creamers, open sugars, and a mug.

Colors are mainly clambroth, marigold, smoke, and white.
