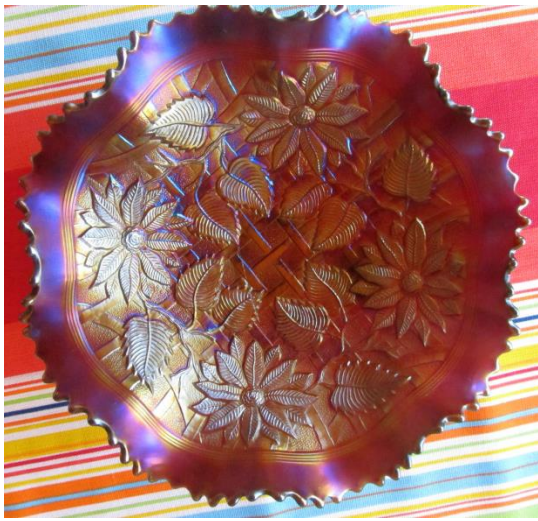

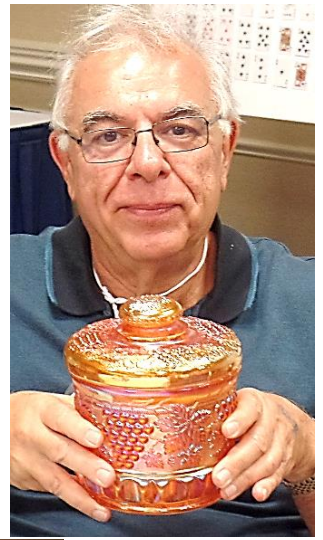

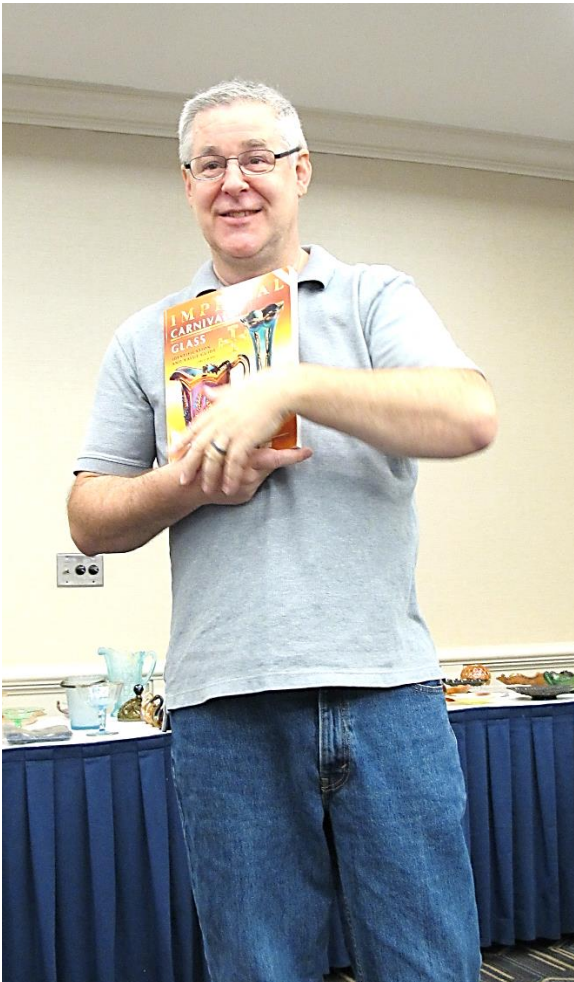

Here is a picture of my Farmyard bowl. As you can see, it has some very nice iridescence. It went originally from the Dugan factory to Australia and was sold by an Aussie to the man I bought it from back in the 1990's. He is downsizing his collection after a recent medical issue and



sold it to me because I tend to procrastinate. LOL! had bought an ice green Grape and Cable centerpiece bowl with the

points going up from him on eBay this past May. After I won it, I emailed him to ask if he could ship it ASAP as I was leaving for Brimfield the following Monday. It did not arrive but I was too busy to email him. When I returned home after a week, it still was not there. I was, for some reason, very lackadaisical and did not email him again. A
