

IMPERIAL 474 COMPOTE by Greg Dilian

Several years ago, I found a rather beautiful piece of Carnival Glass at sale and it took me awhile, as I still rather new in collecting



a yard was

Carnival and had relatively few pieces, to determine what it was. Well, after scouring through Edwards book, I determined that it was the Imperial 474 pattern. Further research indicated that the pattern was reproduced in the 60's or 70's. However, this one was not signed with an IG and from a picture of a newer one determined that mine was indeed old. In fact, I learned that my purple 474 compote was extremely rare and very few exist. It is, in fact, the one pictured in Carl Burns' book on Imperial Carnival Glass.

The other night, I received an email from Dr. Larry Keig, showing me a newer 474 purple compote being sold on ebay as pre-1940 Carnival Glass. Larry had emailed the seller asking if it was signed and the answer was, yes it was. However, in this case, there were other ways to ascertain the age of the piece without asking or looking for an IG trademark.

The newer 474 compotes have a round base and a stippled bottom where the IG can be found. They are very heavy, as well. There is also a Peacock Tail-like pattern on the interior of the bowl. The interior pattern and the shape of the base are the telltale signs one can look for without even picking the piece up to see if there is an IG. These were reproduced by Imperial in amethyst, red, marigold and smoke. I also remember seeing a green one somewhere. A vase and a mug were the only other pieces with the 474 pattern that was issued in the 60-70's. Blue and smoke water sets were also made for special orders.

The older 474 compotes have an octagonal base. There is a star pattern molded on the bottom of the base. The interior is plain. My purple one has the wonderful Imperial purple iridescence that drew me to that company's glass when I started collecting over 23 years ago. Marigold and green were the only other colors made in this shape back then.

So the next time you go into an antique mall and see a 474 compote on the shelf, you won't need to pick it up to see if it has an IG molded into the base. Just check for an interior pattern and/or see if the base is round. If so, it is a repro. But on that rare occasion when you see one with a plain interior and octagonal base, grab it! Tom Burns said he has never seen a purple one and I have seen one other and that now lives in Australia. In all the years I checked, back to 1989, only one purple one has ever appeared in Mordini's price guide. That was at a Wroda auction in 2004 and the price was \$450.


