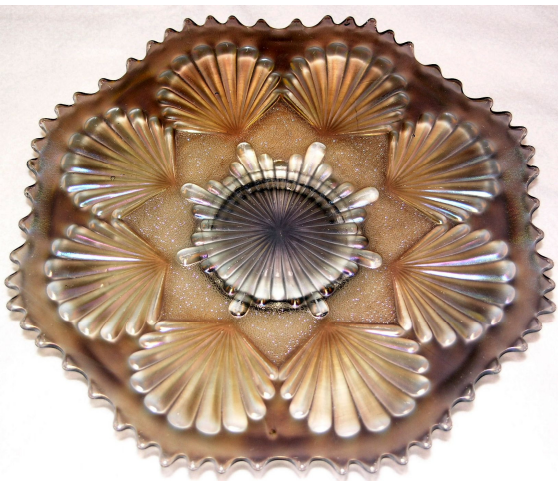

NEW FIND by Kris & Don Dorais and OLD FIND by Bob Smith

Kris and I took a ride on our motorcycle to New Bedford, Mass. and came across a "little cutie" (Kris's term, not mine)...a carnival perfume. We bought it but could not find out what pattern it was, so I emailed Bob Smith, who in turn, emailed Glen Thistlewood.

This perfumer measures 4 1/4" tall without stopper, has a 1 7/8" base diameter and is 5 1/4" tall with stopper in place.

What we found out was quite a coincidence because after I emailed Bob Smith, he realized he had a tumbler (picture below) that had a label on the bottom saying Royal Diamonds.

Glen had emailed back to Bob saying the pattern was "Royal Diamonds aka London and she suspects the maker is Schreiber (Czech) but her proof is currently circumstantial. Mystery solved...somewhat!

NORTHWOOD'S SUNFLOWER by Bob Preseau



Pictured is the Sunflower bowl in pumpkin marigold. Bowls and a plate are the only two shapes known. This bowl measures 8-3/4" Wide by 3-1/4" high. Note: measurements of these bowls may vary. The interior of the bowl is the motif of the sunflower which takes up the interior of the bowl. Every petal is finely stippled. The exterior of the bowl is the meander pattern along with three (3) spatula footed feet.



When The Northwood Company produced this carnival piece, it imagined that only the primary colors exist. The Bowls are known in a dark rich marigold, purple, green, and blue. However, time has passed and a variety of shades of color have been found and reported or simply named. Cobalt Blue, Teal, and Ice Blue are recorded. Ice Blue would be considered the rarest color of all. We cannot forget the shade of Aqua Opal.

More colors have been discovered to date: Renniger Blue, Sapphire Blue, Lavender, Clambroth, Emerald Green and the list goes on. Who can keep up with them all!

There is however only one spatula footed plate reported in Marigold. Measurements of the plate are unknown at this time unless someone comes forward with it.

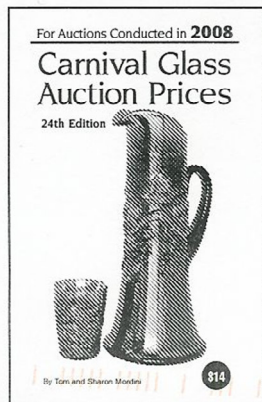
Others may exist and lay dormant but for now all other colors have not been cataloged.

DUGAN'S DAHLIA FRUIT BOWL by Moe Myers

This small 4+1/2" x 2+1/2" Fruit Bowl in Purple is from the Berry Set and is not easily found. This four footed beauty with a Dahlia on each foot as well as a larger Dahlia located on the four sides surrounded by ornate scrolls is sometimes found with blue, red or gold painted Dahlias. The interior also sports a large Dahlia. The complete sets are highly desired and tend to be expensive.
